The Australian Network for Art and Technology (ANAT) is working in close collaboration with Inter-Society for the Electronic Arts (ISEA) founders of the Symposia, and other international and Australian cultural organisations to co-ordinate the event.

To ensure the success of TISEA, the TISEA Co-ordinating Committee is determined to maintain a responsive interaction with the significant network of people and organisations connected as a result of the First and Second Symposia staged in the Netherlands in Utrecht in '88 and Groningen in '90.

All correspondence is welcome!

This first newsletter is devoted to the formal Call for Proposals. Future editions will circulate registration forms, the preliminary program and information on attendance fees, accommodation and travel

TISEA will be structured similarly to the First and Second International Symposia on Electronic Art staged in the Netherlands. The first two days of the five day symposium will offer a series of one-day, two-day and half-day workshops and courses, followed by two days of papers and panels. Day five will be devoted to poster sessions, which provide an opportunity for individuals to present up-to-the-minute talks about their various areas of research and endeavour. Programmed evening events will include a film and video program, and a program of performance. The exhibition component involving some of Sydney's major galleries will include a survey show of recent work, curated exhibitions, installations, a continuous slide show, radio broadcasts and TV showcase. Other special events are being planned and opportunites for informal participation will also be catered for.

Workshops convene for one or two day sessions. They provide a unique opportunity for groups of up to 20 people to gain access to expert skills, to gain first-hand experience of new techniques and software, to compare work and/or address unresolved issues in the interaction of art, science, culture and technology. Workshops may aim to produce reports, or simply to define issues for future research and development.

workshops and courses

Courses can convene for half day, one day or two day sessions. They provide opportunities for acquiring skills and knowledge across a wide range of computer related areas, from advanced programming through to esoteric applications and methodologies. Organisers are invited to present tutorials specific to their areas of expertise.

Workshop/Course dates

How to submit

Send 3 copies of your proposal to the Workshops and Courses Chair. It must include the following:

- 1. Workshop or Course title
- Summary of topics to be discussed, and how they will be presented as a coherent body of knowledge
- A statement providing enough information for attendees to assess the value of the program: what knowledge can participants expect to gain, what level of skills are required, etc.
- 4. Intended audience
- 5. Selected curriculum vitae
- 6. Selected supporting material
- 7. Equipment requirements.

Upon Acceptance

The Course organiser agrees to prepare a set of course notes suitable for distribution to course participants. Workshop organisers agree to prepare background reading for distribution to attendees.

papers and panels

The TISEA Papers and Panels program offers a unique opportunity, for leading researchers, artists and academics to address a wide range of issues related to the electronic arts. Papers should present original work, review emerging trends or explore the major themes for the Symposium ie. 'Art and the Algorithm', and 'Whither Cultural Diversity in the Global Village?' Presentations may also take the form of a videotape in instances where the speaker is unable to attend the conference. Video Papers will be accepted in any widely used video format but high-quality VHS tapes are preferred. Video Papers will be presented using projection systems and/or be available for individual viewing.

Panels provide the opportunity to amplify these themes, bringing a number of disparate voices into a formal arena for fruitful public discussion and debate. Papers and Panels will run in parallel. Abstracts for papers will be circulated at the conference. Controversy is encouraged.

How to submit

Send 3 copies of your proposal to the Papers and Panels Chair. It must include the following:

- 1. Panel/Paper title
- 2. An abstract of 100-300 words for a paper

or

A description of the panel topic, including position statements from each panelist. (The Chair must discuss their proposal with panelists before submission.)

- 3. Selected curriculum vitae.
- 4. Selected supporting material

Individuals presenting papers (including video papers) will be expected to provide a printed copy of their paper to the TISEA Coordinating Committee subsequent to notification for inclusion in the official TISEA Papers Publication.

Deadline for proposals 1 April 1992.

The Exhibitions program will showcase innovative contemporary electronic artworks from around the world and present work from a number of leading artists in curated exhibitions. Individual artists are invited to submit their work for inclusion in the Symposium Showcase, which will present two- and three-dimensional and time-based exhibits in a survey exhibition. Works may also be submitted for inclusion in the Artist's Slideshow, a programmed selection of artists 35mm slides in a theatrette environment. Slides can include reproductions of artist's works or documentation of exhibitions and projects.

How to submit

Send 3 copies of your proposal and one set of slides to the Exhibitions Chair. It must include:

- Title and description of the work intended for exhibition, including a floor plan or drawing, video or audio cassette (if applicable).
- 2. Up to 5 slides of your work, properly labelled
- 3. An artist's statement of 100-300 words to contextualise the work
- 4. Current, selected curriculum vitae
- 5. Selected supporting material

NB: slides of accepted works will be retained by TISEA





Send 3 copies of your Electronic Theatre proposal and one VHS copy of the work labelled with name and contact details of contributor, title and duration of work, to the Electronic Theatre Chair. It must include:

- 1. Title of the work intended for screening
- 2. Indication of tape/film exhibition format
- 3. An artists statement of 100-300 words for catalogue inclusion
- 4. Selected curriculum vitae
- 5. Selected supporting material
- 6. 3 slides from the work

Upon Acceptance

Upon notification of selection, artists are responsible for forwarding an exhibition copy of the selected work to the Electronic Theatre Chair by 1 October.

This Performance program will present exciting new explorations of the synthesis of live performance and electronic media. We invite submissions from performers who work across a variety of disciplines to present their work as part of the symposium. Music, danceworks, performances by computers, and other works argued as performance will be considered. Non-traditional modes of presentation are encouraged.

Send 3 copies of your proposal and one VHS, audiotape or set of slides to the Performance Chair. It must include:

- 1. Title, duration and concise description of the work.
- 3 slides of your work, properly labelled.
- An artist's statement of 100-300 words for catalogue inclusion.
- 4. Selected curriculum vitae.
- 5. Selected supporting material.
- 6. Personnel, including performers and crew.
- 7. Estimated set up and strike times.
- 8. Description of required performance environment.
- 9. Equipment requirements.

Deadline for proposals 1 April 1992.

poster sessions

Day Five will be devoted to Poster Sessions, which provide an exciting opportunity for individuals to present up-to-the-minute talks about their various areas of research and endeavour to small audiences in an environment more intimate than a lecture theatre. The venues will be equipped with basic audio-visual equipment and TISEA will make all efforts to accommodate special equipment requirements given enough advance notice. Proposals which don't fit into the traditional panel/paper format are accommodated in this forum.

Sessions will be parallel, and of up to 45 minutes duration.
